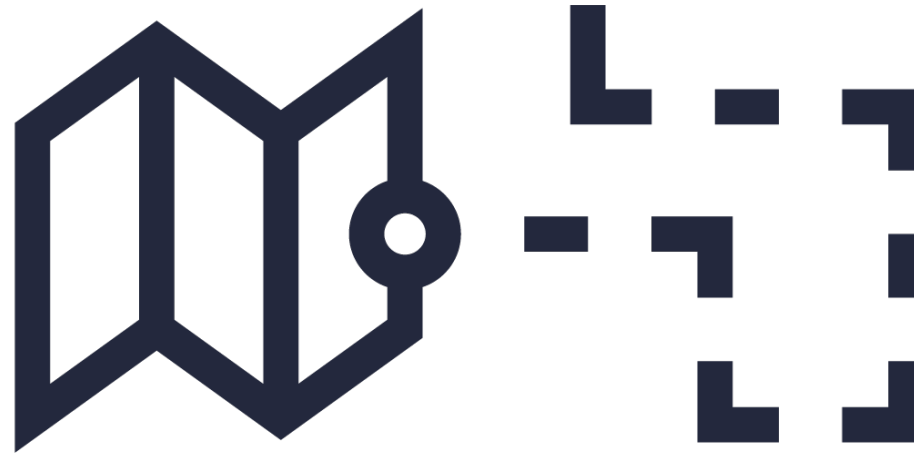

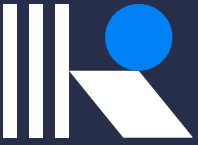
## Background

- Core planning activities per 23 CFR Part 450C
- MPOs must develop a new MTP and TIP every four years
- MTP
  - 20-year planning horizon – new plan goes to 2050
  - Slate of planned projects directed by goals and objectives
  - Socioeconomic and travel model forecasting
  - Air quality conformity
- TIP
  - All federally funded projects and regionally significant state funded projects
  - Fiscally constrained



## Project Development

- What projects should be submitted?
  - Secured federal funding between FY23 – 26
  - Regionally significant state funded projects
  - Included in sponsors existing short- and long-range plans
  - Projects seeking discretionary grants such as USDOT RAISE & MPO dedicated
- Project details
  - Basics: name, description, cost, estimated open to public (OTP) date, etc.
    - Sufficient scope to allow for appropriate air quality analysis
  - Evaluation criteria: certain questions to assist staff with project evaluations
  - TIP Funding: **ONLY** if the sponsor secured federal/state funding between FY23-26



## Project Evaluation Criteria

- Anticipated TPC approval on July 28, 2022
- Provides systematic approach to ranking projects
- Relies on best available data & emphasis on goals, objectives and performance measures
- Two parts (100 points each for total of 200)
  - Common criteria: economic development, future economic development, environmental impact, environmental justice, local priority, planning study
  - Modal criteria (bike/ped, roadway and transit)
    - Mobility & Access
    - Safety
    - Resiliency & Sustainability



## Timeline

Sponsors submit project application	August 8 – October 31, 2022
Staff review and evaluation	August 22 – November 14, 2022
Performance impacts and analysis	October 31, 2022 – January 23, 2023
Air quality conformity analysis	December 26, 2022 – January 23, 2023
Public outreach	February 27 – March 29, 2023
TTCC recommendation and TPC approval	April 12 and April 27, 2023
Federal review	April 28 – June 23, 2023



## Process

- Existing Projects
  - Staff sends Excel file to sponsors with existing project info
    - Review info and update OTP date, project cost, TIP funding and/or remove project
    - Submit new Project Application form if any other details such as scope are changing
- New Projects
  - Submit a new project application



## Project Application

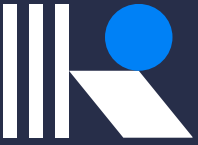
- New project application form using ArcGIS' Survey123 software
  - Reduced administrative burden
  - Streamlined with far fewer questions
  - Less technical (e.g. no need to adjust mapping buffers)
  - Aligned w/ updated project evaluation criteria
  - Integrates with ArcGIS allowing for semi-automated evaluation
  - Questions about USDOT emphasis areas such as resiliency (e.g. green infrastructure)

## Overview

- MPO dedicated funds suballocated from INDOT and KYTC
- TPC has authority to award these funds
- Official guidance document released no later than August 8<sup>th</sup>
- Workshops recorded for future use
- Additional one-on-one technical assistance may be provided
- Applications and guidance will be located on KIPDA's [Transportation Planning Portal](#)



## Programs and Estimated Available Funding

Funding Program	Indiana	Kentucky
Carbon Reduction Program (CRP)	\$2,000,000	\$16,000,000
Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ)	\$6,000,000	N/A
Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP)	\$3,000,000	N/A
Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG)	\$9,000,000	\$39,000,000
Transportation Alternatives (TA)	\$2,000,000	\$9,000,000
<b>Total</b>	<b>\$22,000,000</b>	<b>\$64,000,000</b>



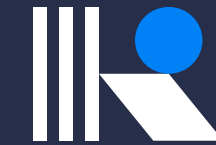
## Project Eligibility

- CRP
  - Reduce single occupancy vehicle use (bicycle, pedestrian & transit)
  - CMAQ and TA eligible projects
  - Other projects if reduction in emission demonstrated
  
- CMAQ (additional air quality analysis required – CMAQ emissions calculator toolkit)
  - Reduce single occupancy vehicle use
  - Enhance vehicle fleet electrification or use of alternative fuels
  - Deploy innovative or energy efficient infrastructure
  - Shared micromobility (e.g. e-bike infrastructure)
  
- TA
  - Bicycle and pedestrian focused with some transit improvements



## Project Eligibility (continued)

- HSIP (unique 90/10 funding split)
  - Consistent w/ INDOT or KYTC's strategic highway safety plan (SHSP)
  - Identified based on crash experience, crash potential, crash rate, etc.
  - FHWA proven safety countermeasures automatically eligible
  - INDOT eligible systemic improvements
  - Other projects may be eligible but must complete a benefit cost analysis (not recommended)
  
- STBG
  - Bridge and tunnel projects
  - Bicycle and pedestrian focused projects
  - Any roadway project other than those located on a road functionally classified as a local road or rural minor collector unless it was on the Federal-aid highway system on January 1, 1991



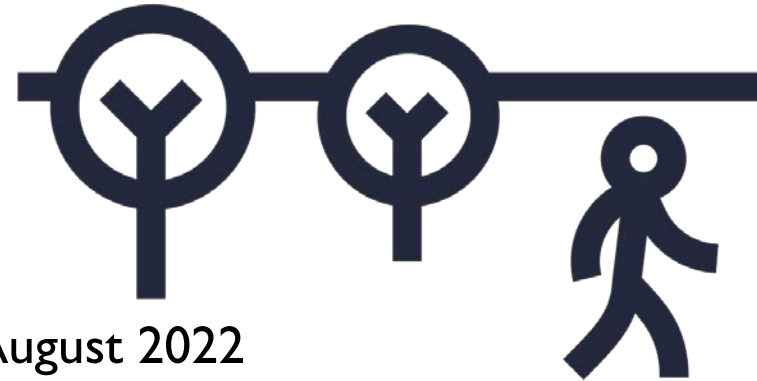
## USDOT Priorities

- ADA
- Climate change and sustainability
- Complete streets
- Equity
- Labor and Workforce
- Safety
- Transferability between programs
- Transit Flex
- Truck Parking



## Complete Streets Policy (CSP)

- KIPDA finalized draft CSP
- TTCC Working Group recently received the final draft
- Staff will present the CSP to committees for action in August 2022
- CSP applies to all projects seeking MPO dedicated funding
- To comply sponsors must indicate how a project will accommodate bike, pedestrian **and/or** transit modes
- Context sensitive design



## Complete Streets Policy (continued)

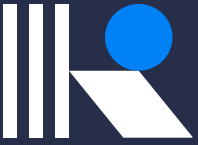
- Exemption required for projects that cannot accommodate any of the three modes
- Seven exemptions
  - Prohibited by law
  - Maintenance and other projects such as guardrail installation
  - Installation of traffic control devices
  - Where an existing facility already accommodates user groups
  - Excessively disproportionate cost relative to use or need
  - Lack of population or other factors that indicate absence of need both current/future
  - Alternative facilities already exist
- TTCC Working Group determines whether exemption justification complies
- TPC must approve



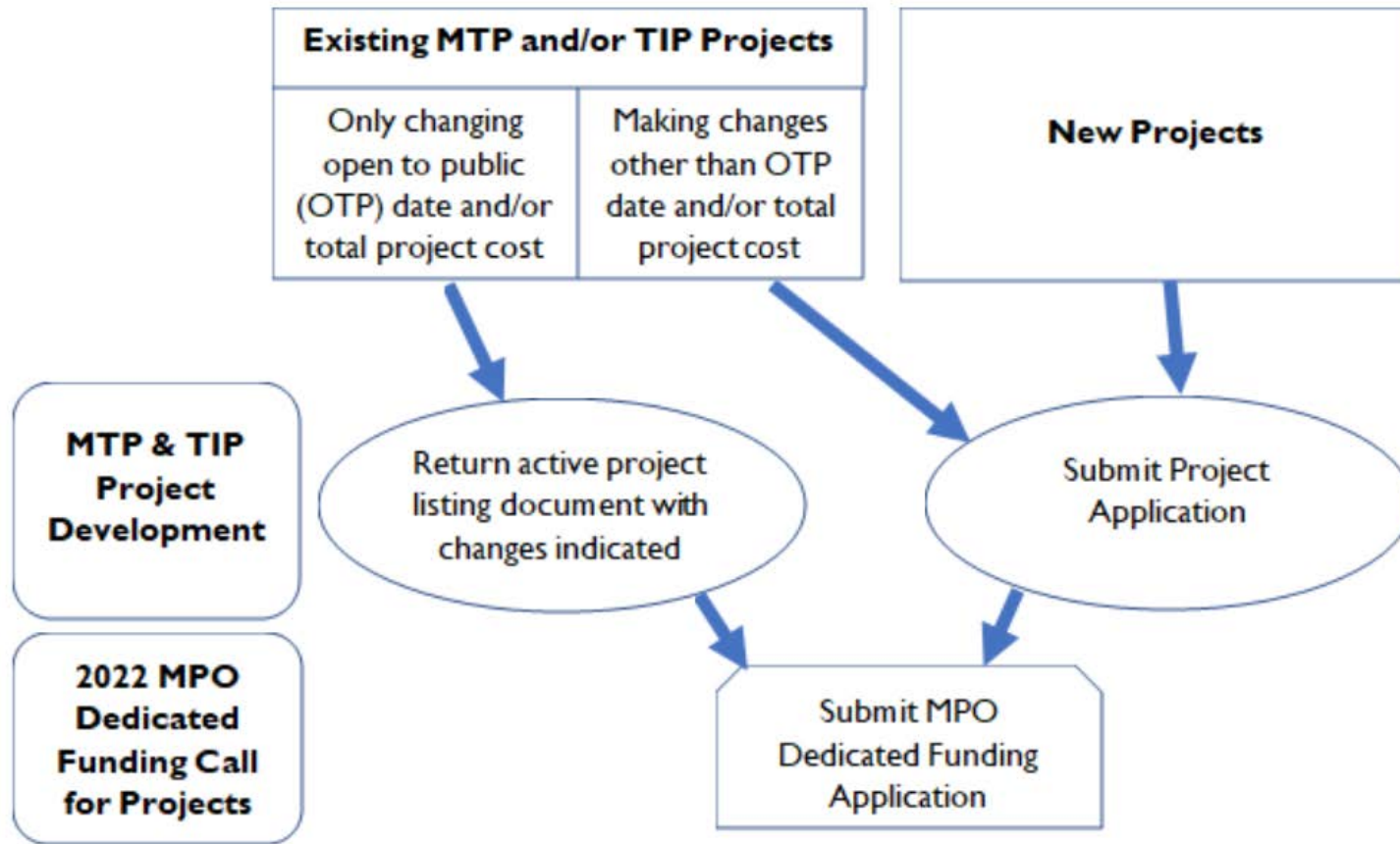


## Process and Schedule

- 1. Submit Project Application between August 8 – October 31
  - New projects must submit a new Project Application
  - Existing projects
    - No Project Application needed for changes to OTP, project cost or TIP funding
    - New Project Application required if other changes are needed
- 2. Submit MPO Dedicated Funding Application between August 8 – October 31
- 3. Staff reviews applications from November to December 2022
- 4. TTCC Working Group develop funding recommendations in January 2023
- 5. Staff presents funding recommendations to committees for action in February 2023
- 6. Staff issues funding award letters in March 2023



## Process and Schedule (continued)



## KYTC's 2022 CMAQ Application Cycle

- KYTC's Office of Local Programs (OLP) will formally announce soon
- No estimated amount available, but KYTC receives \$14M annually
- Application window: August 15 – September 30, 2022
- Virtual meeting(s) prior to application cycle
- MPOs submit prioritization lists for prospective projects



## KYTC's 2022 CMAQ Application Cycle (continued)

- Sponsors should:
  - Submit KIPDA Project Application for new projects or update info for existing MTP projects
  - Submit CMAQ application to KYTC through their [website](#)
  - Coordinate with KIPDA to complete the CMAQ emissions calculator toolkit
- KIPDA staff will:
  - Review applications and develop recommended prioritization list
  - Present recommendations to committees for action and send list to KYTC
